Did you know?

It is well known that the father of television presenter David Frost, Rev W J P Frost (known as Paradine Frost) was minister of Raunds Methodist Church between 1954 and 1957 but it is not widely known that an ancestor of another television personality was also minister of the same church in 1891.

Reverend Henry Parkes, was great grandfather of TV chef, Rick Stein. Henry Parkes was born in Antigua in 1839 to Methodist missionary parents. In 1863 **Henry** was a Wesleyan Methodist minister and one of a small group of priests who were asked to take Christianity to China following China's defeat by the British in the second Opium War of 1856-60.

Henry and his new wife, Annie, and their children lived on the eastern side of Canton Province (now known as Guangzhou), an area where smallpox, cholera, typhoid and bubonic plague were endemic. Hundreds of thousands died in the region over the next few years. With four children under the age of six, Henry was understandably concerned for the health and safety of his family. As a missionary, his job was not only to preach, but also to help establish schools, hospitals and orphanages. Apart from the Parkes and a few other missionary families, there were no other Europeans in the region.

In 1873 Henry applied to return to England and he was allowed to come on furlough in 1874 but it was not until 1882, when he had been in China for nearly 20 years, that the family was allowed to leave permanently. By this time two of their children had died within 3 weeks of each other.

Henry was sent to Oxenhope in Yorkshire to minister and in August 1891 the Northampton Mercury reported that Reverend Henry Parkes had been appointed as minister of Raunds Methodist Church. Northampton Chronicle and Echo of October 29th 1891 reports on two services at Thrapston Wesleyan Church where Rev Henry Parkes preached and where he is described as a 'returned missionary from China'

Henry Parkes died in Streatham in 1926 in his 87th year. His daughter Mary was the grandmother of Rick Stein.


