### **From our Minister**



We have just bought some new furniture, and yes, its all come in boxes. Each box containing assorted pieces of wood, plastic and metal, which on correct assembly, it is promised, will become the furniture purchased. So then comes several hours, ok days, of fun!

When it comes to putting things together I have a definite approach, open it all up, quickly scan the instructions and get stuck in.

Usually this works, as I have a fairly logical mind and some practical skills. But occasionally something will be a bit obscure and then it's back to deciphering the instructions.

I think this also applies to life! Sometimes we can get by without the instructions, but when it comes to putting together a life that reflects the goodness and wisdom of God, we can't afford to ignore the directions He's given to us in the Bible

For instance, when the Israelites returned to their land following their Babylonian captivity they need to re-establish themselves in their home land. And as they began to re-establish worship, they prepared to do so "in accordance with what is written in the Law of Moses" (EZRA 3:2). By building a proper altar and in celebrating the Feast of Tabernacles as prescribed by God in Leviticus 23:33-43, they did exactly what God's directions told them to do. In other words went back to the instructions!


Christ gave His followers some directions too. He said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your

# Did you know?

#### Heritage Assets & the Neighbourhood Plan

You may remember in the May edition of the Newsletter we ran an article on the proposed Axe & Compass Development. The original planning application for this in 2023 was withdrawn due to concerns from the Heritage Officer at North Northamptonshire Council. Since then the plans have been reviewed taking into account comments made and also the conditions laid down in the Ringstead Neighbourhood Plan. I thought it would be interesting to highlight the relevant sections of the Neighbourhood Plan as they relate to a non designated heritage asset and in particular the Axe & Compass. The term 'non designated' signifies that it is not nationally listed but does have a local significance.

The Plan identifies the Axe and Compass as a Community Service and Facility. As such any development needs to enhance this aspect of the building.

The Plan identifies key issues from community consultation and those relevant for any future development are as follows: -

- Maintaining the character of the village
- Improving or retaining local services and facilities
- Conserving local heritage
- More employment opportunities for local people

In addition the section on employment in the Plan identifies 'tourism and the development of a higher value visitor economy' as 'a key economic opportunity for the area'. The proposal to add hotel accommodation to the Axe and Compass clearly complies with all of the key issues; local heritage is conserved by ensuring the viability of the business going forward. Policy R1 in the Neighbourhood Plan states 'the determination of planning applications which would affect features of local heritage interest will balance the need for, or public benefit of, the proposed development against the significance of the asset and the extent to which it will be harmed'.

The modified plans are now available on the North Northamptonshire Council's website and the reference is NE/24/00421/FUL. This is a good opportunity for the local economy and comments supporting the application will help to ensure it is approved. The deadline for comments is  $3^{rd}$  July 2024.

All who wish to join can do so using the Church Zoom link, or use the liturgy above at another time during the day.




