#### From our Minister



You will have seen, no doubt, the way in which the American election is being run. With both Trump and Biden pointing fingers at each other, and giving all sorts or reasons why they are not suitable to be president. The focus is very much on them, and what they can or can't do.

In contrast, during his only inaugural address as president, John F. Kennedy issued this challenge to Americans:

"Ask not what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country."

It was a renewed call for them to surrender their lives in sacrifice and service to others. His words especially inspired the sons and daughters of men and women who had served their country in war.

His meaning was clear: what their parents purchased, often with their very lives, must now be protected by peaceful means. An army of volunteers arose to answer that call, and through the decades they have accomplished an immeasurable amount of humanitarian work around the globe.

Centuries earlier, the apostle Paul issued a similar call to Christians in the opening verses of Romans 12. (see Romans 12:1-8)

Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service.

Here he urges us to give our bodies as "living sacrifices" in service to the One who paid with His life for our sins. This spiritual sacrifice must be more than mere words; it must be an investment of our lives in the physical, emotional and spiritual well being of others.

Best of all, our serving can be done right where we are.

Let's use these verses as our mantra for August, and why not then join together to look at more from Romans in September.


We are constantly being asked where we get our surplus items from. The way everything is given to us is quite staggering. Our own Knit and Natter team leave us astounded with the amount of goods they knit or sew and there is another knitting group in Sutton Coldfield which supplies us with hats, scarves and small knitted toys. Many of you will remember Sheila Clipston who lived in Ringstead and moved to Wales with her daughter, Jane. They provide bags of pencils, rubbers etc and fun things for children. We have connections with a young woman who lives in Warwickshire. We won't mention her name but she likes to find bits and pieces to brighten the life of a child. Recently she sent us a parcel of goodies including a hot water bottle with a cover in the shape of a fox, it's quite cute. This is part of her letter;

#### Did you know?

#### Mallows Cotton deserted medieval village



I wonder how many people in Ringstead are familiar with Mallows Cotton, the northern part of this deserted village lies within Ringstead Parish. The site can be accessed from the track on the left just before you reach the old railway track. Head up this track for just over 1km to Top Lodge and then turn right down hill keeping the hedge to your left. The field

fence and gate at the bottom of the hill mark the edge of the site.

The remains of the village are defined as a Scheduled Monument and have legal protection as a nationally important site. Mallows Cotton is a Norman settlement that dates back to the 12<sup>th</sup> Century. It is one of three small settlements, each known as Cotton which lay along the edge of the River Nene. The other two settlements were Mill Cotton and West Cotton.

A few stones marking the position of houses are still visible on the site. A large rectangular platform in the North Western side is believed to contain the buried remains of the Manor House. In the South West of the village, ditches and banks indicate agricultural activity with several long crofts or closes.

In 1909 the site was excavated by C.V.Charlton who discovered several round houses that were possibly granaries, a stone-built house with moulded door jambs and a church that looked to have been destroyed by fire.

There is very little in the way of documented records of the village and certainly no record of when it was abandoned. An Enclosure Map drawn up in 1798 shows that no-one was living there at that time, but there is no information as to how long ago it ceased to be inhabited.

Many small communities became unviable around this period due to illegal enclosure of common land by rich landowners. This was used for keeping sheep which required very little labour. The peasants who lived in the villages were forced to find work in nearby towns. This could well have been the fate of Mallows Cotton.

#### **The Romans Course**

#### **Explore the Letter to the Romans**

The Romans Course is a ten-session programme which helps you study Paul's letter to the Romans. The course tackles ten big themes found in the book of Romans which are key to understanding the Christian faith:

**Gospel** – How can we become confident in our faith?

Sin – What's wrong with the world?

**Salvation** – What's so amazing about grace?

Peace – How can we find rest in a stressful world?

Freedom – How can we avoid negative cycles?

**Hope** – What has God promised?

Mystery – If God is sovereign, what is our role?

**Devotion** – How can we live full on for God?

**Community** – How can we live together in love?

**Mission** – How can we be ambitious with the gospel?

We are planning to run these each week on a Monday afternoon and a Thursday evening starting with session 1 on Monday 16<sup>th</sup>, and Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> September. The Monday session will be in person in the school room, while the Thursday evening one will be via zoom.


