Each month I write a letter for this magazine. I'try to be creative and interesting, and usually make a point too. This month the letter is about letters though. You see I realised that as we begin September we are going to focus on two of the letters in the Bible in church.

As I mentioned last month, our weekly 'Bible Groups' will begin an exploration of the letter to the Romans. Each Monday afternoon and

Thursday evening (starting Monday 16th, and Thursday 19th September) we will tackle together some of the big themes from the book. Including topics such as: How can we become confident in our faith? What's so amazing about grace? How can we find rest in a stressful world? & How can we live together in love? The course will be based around videos from the bible society and group discussion.

Whilst on Sundays we are going to look at the letter of James. There has been much debate about the identity of James and therefore about the context in which the letter was written. However the letter reflects the concerns of a Jewish Christian community in the Holy Land around 60AD. In this letter we will find is a real concern for the poor and needy, for the persecuted, and the idea of the righteous sufferer pervades the message. Wisdom, the piety of the poor, and moving towards perfection or wholeness are themes of this letter, which above all is an urgent summons to believers to live out the faith.

So come along and explore these two letters together and see if my monthly letters match up!!

Did you know?

Cut Throat Cottage

I was talking someone who had recently moved into the village. He was quite surprised to find that his new home in Back Lane was known locally as cut throat cottage. Looking into the reason for the name I was confronted by a tragic and grisly tale.

Harry William James Cope was born in 1877 and came from a Ringstead shoe making family. At the age of thirteen Harry was working as a boot closer and by the time he was twenty four he was a shoe maker like his father. In 1909 he married Lucy Bird and they went on to have three boys and a girl, the oldest boy, Reginald, died in infancy. In late 1917 Lucy died from a severe fever leaving Harry a widower with three children. At the time of Lucy's death Harry would have been eligible to being conscripted into the British Army which at the time was at war with Germany. It seems that at around the time of his wife's death he received his call up papers, understandably with the turmoil going on in his life he was late in claiming an exemption. This claim was rejected by the Tribunal in February 1918 on the grounds that it was late. The Tribunal went on to recommend that Harry should be graded to see if he qualified for exemption. The rejection of the claim weighed heavily on his mind with his main concern being the welfare of his children. Four days later he picked the boys up from Ringstead School and prepared them dinner before sending them to bed. He was last seen at 9:30 that evening when he went to collect water from a well before returning home. Harry then bolted both doors and locked the shutters to stop anyone entering. The family was found the next day when a



fellow shoe maker noticed something wrong and broke in. He found Harry and the two boys dead with their throats cut. Evidently the elder boy had put up a fight as he had many cuts to his face before Harry managed to cut his throat. The two year old daughter was staying with a family friend and ended up in a Raunds children's home.

ADVICE FOR PARTICIPANTS

We are delighted that you are going out to visit our wonderful churches and hopefully have lots of sponsors. The list shows all the churches in Northamptonshire taking part this year but, like last year, there may be some last-minute changes.

Churches may not be open but you will hopefully find a register in the porch. If no register, or the church is not taking part, maybe take a photo for your sponsors. Many churches are planning to welcome people, provide refreshments, and have a toilet available, but some may have to be closed at short notice. The churches are listed in Deaneries but remember there may be churches very near each other in different Deaneries. And, of course, you can also cross into other counties. See list below.

Before the day, obtain sponsorship from family and friends. A signature is not required for Gift Aid. Encourage them, if they are taxpayers, to let you fill in the Gift Aid section (name, home address, postcode, tick box and date) as this allows us to claim from the Government's Gift Aid scheme and costs the sponsor nothing. Please complete the section on the front with your details (required for sponsors' Gift Aid).

Take care! Please cycle responsibly and carefully especially if cycling in a group. We strongly recommend you study all the relevant sections of the Highway Code. Make sure that your bike is roadworthy. Wear helmet and hi vis clothing. Walkers - take care on country roads.

Some of the churches you visit may not be open, however at each one you visit, please, if there is a helper, ask them to fill in or initial your entry on the back of your form. If the building is closed or no one is about, complete the back of the form yourself.

After the event, collect your sponsorship money and hand it, with the sponsorship form, to your Local Organiser. Half the money collected will be returned to the church or chapel of your choice, the other half plus Gift Aid retained by Northamptonshire Historic Churches Trust to give out as grants. Explore the Letter to the Romans

The Romans Course is a ten-session programme which helps you study Paul's letter to the Romans. The course tackles ten big themes found in the book of Romans which are key to understanding the Christian faith:

- Gospel How can we become confident in our faith?
- Sin What's wrong with the world?
- Salvation What's so amazing about grace?
- Peace How can we find rest in a stressful world?
- Freedom How can we avoid negative cycles?
- Hope What has God promised?
- · Mystery If God is sovereign, what is our role?
- Devotion How can we live full on for God?
- Community How can we live together in love?
- Mission How can we be ambitious with the gospel?

We are planning to run these each week on a Monday afternoon and a Thursday evening starting with session 1 on Monday 16that 2:30pm, and Thursday 19th September at 7:30pm. The Monday session will be in person in the school room, while the Thursday evening one will be via zoom.


