It's choir practice again, and there is the usual murmuring amongst the ranks, the choice of music, new choir robes and of course the quality of the after rehearsal snacks! Suddenly all goes quiet as the angel Gabriel, enters and stands before the angelic choir

"Right, angels, pay attention. Operation `Good News' is scheduled for tonight. You've all seen

the message which the Lord God wants proclaimed. You'll probably never take part in a more important mission, so I don't want anyone making mistakes. Angel Fiona - what is the good news?"

Did you know?

Ringstead Station

During a recent steam train excursion to York I got to thinking about the story of train travel prior to the infamous Beeching Axe, in particular the history of Ringstead Station. The Station was located on the line that ran from Northampton to Peterborough and was opened in 1845. The introduction of the railway opened up many trading opportunities for businesses based in or near Ringstead. One example of this was Woodford Mill which operated an Eel trap located to the left of the water wheel. The trap could catch around 25 kilograms of Eels overnight and a ready market for these was found in London, they could be transported by train within a few hours enabling them to be jellied and on market stalls the same day, a feat that would be impressive even today! The trade must have been a particularly lucrative one as a halt was built near the mill for the train to stop at to load the Eels. The building associated with the halt can still be seen when walking the route of the old railway line.

Ringstead Station was renamed to Ringstead & Addington in 1898 and closed in 1964, the freight handling ceased in the March of that year



with passenger services stopping in May. The trade in Eels ended sometime after 1955 and the trap was filled in, but the exact year is uncertain. The access to the station from Ringstead was via Station Road with the platforms being staggered either side of the level crossing. Access from Great and Little Adding-

ton was rudimentary and partly across stepping stones made from former railway sleeper blocks. These still remain although covered in overgrowth.


